# 2024 MINUTES

---

The Annual Meeting was held on Wednesday, April 24, 2024 at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center in Duluth, MN.

Meeting was called to order by Board Chair Lindsay Marshall.

## **Approval of 2023 Minutes**

Dustin Heckman moved to approve the 2023 minutes, and was duly seconded by a member in good standing. Members present voted to approve the 2023 minutes.

## **Acceptance of 2023 Treasurer's Report**

Maureen Kelly Jonason moved to approve the treasurer's report, and Britt Dahl seconded; members present voted to approve the report.

## **Alliance Coordinator's Report**

New Alliance Coordinator Liz Koele shared highlights occurring over the past year, including wet salvage training sessions and emergency response planning workshops (a collaboration between MALHM's Mutual Assistance Team and the Midwest Art Conservation Center), and then the creation and distribution of twelve emergency response supply caches (generously funded by Minitex).

## **CollectiveAccess Report**

Ann Grandy provided an overview of the C/A Team's efforts. Highlights included that over 50 organizations now subscribe to C/A and that these organization have inventoried well over 1 million objects, with almost 300,000 records shared with the public.

## **Election of Board Members 2024-2026**

Election: Lindsay Marshall, Dave Nichols, and Adam Smith for 3rd terms; Corrie Hackbarth for 2nd term. Ann Grandy moved to re-elect the board nominees, and Merlin Peterson seconded; members present voted to approve the nominees' re-election.

## **Volunteer Recognition**

MALHM introduced its second annual recognition of volunteers. Each MALHM member organization was given the opportunity to submit the name of one volunteer. Twenty-five individuals were recognized by name in the conference program.

Dustin Heckman moved to adjourn, and Jeremy Murray seconded; members present voted to adjourn.

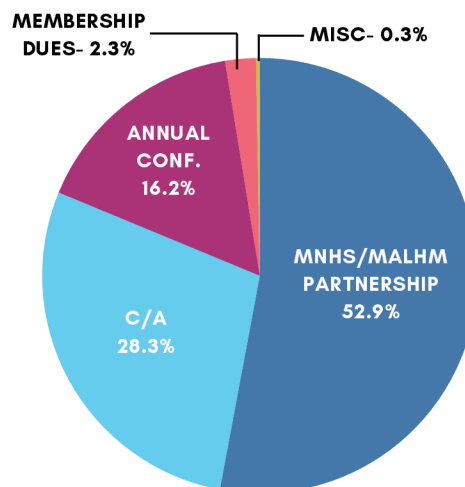
## PAYROLL

MALHM began using its first payroll system in July 2024! Previously, payroll & taxes were calculated manually by the MALHM Treasurer.

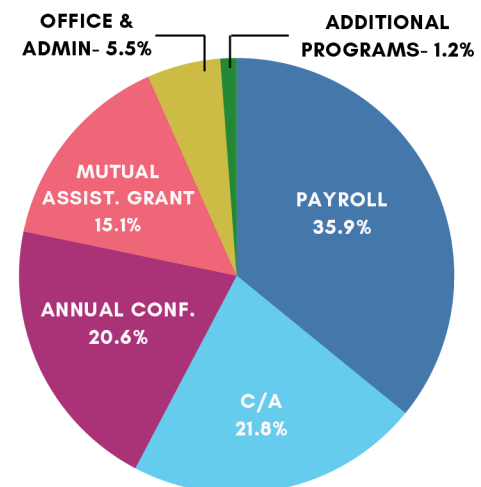
## INVESTMENTS

The Alliance continues to expand and grow. Deployment of our 12 emergency supply caches was completed last May, and the MALHM Mutual Assistance Team has already used them to respond to several aid requests. Organizations continue to join CollectiveAccess. I also was able to travel across the state, from New Ulm to Thief River Falls, visiting museums, historical societies, and regional history groups. ## COLLECTIVEACCESS

CollectiveAccess Minnesota (CA) is an open-source collections management software created by Whirl-i-Gig and supported by the Minnesota Alliance of Local History Museums. It is designed to help local history museums keep track of their collections; from *what* artifacts they have and *where* they are stored, to connecting the artifacts to the people, organizations, and places within their community.

CA is fully financially self-sustaining. CA member organizations pay a small annual fee that covers the shared web hosting, backup costs, and allows us to set aside funds for technical support and future server expansion.

CollectiveAccess Minnesota currently has more than **60 member organizations** across the state who have inventoried more than **1.1 million objects** in their private cataloging systems. Some of these organizations have opted to make portions of their collection public and are sharing over **350,000 records** on MNCollections.org.

In the spirit of “peers helping peers,” the project is overseen by the CollectiveAccess Team, that guides the project manager and recommends software changes based on user requests. The Project Manager provides training and support for incoming organizations throughout the conversion process, and then offers on-going monthly training for existing users. The Project Manager and MALHM Coordinator are also in frequent communication with other CollectiveAccess users and museum consortiums throughout Canada and the United States to discuss shared issues and updates.

We onboard new organizations twice a year on the following schedule:

Data transfer & set up can take 1-3 months after the start date depending on the complexity of your data and how quickly you can respond to set-up and customization questions.
